

Racial slur at teen sheds light on racism in mostly white CT town

The incident has renewed a debate over race in town, and on Tuesday, about 100 people gathered at Enfield High School to bring their thoughts, ideas and concerns to a meeting dubbed a "Community Conversation on Race, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion."

ENFIELD – A BLACK MEMBER OF THE ENFIELD HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL TEAM APPROACHED A LOCAL HOME ON AUG. 13 HOPING TO SELL RAFFLE TICKETS TO RAISE

FUNDS FOR THE UPCOMING SEASON. HE MADE MANY STOPS ALONG THE WAY, BUT HIS ENCOUNTER AT THIS HOUSE WAS MUCH DIFFERENT WITH A RESIDENT CALLING THE <u>14-YEAR-OLD</u> <u>STUDENT A RACIAL SLUR</u>, ENFIELD

POLICE SAID.

IN A TOWN OF MORE THAN 42,000 PEOPLE, COMPRISED OF NEARLY 80 PERCENT WHITE PEOPLE AND 7 PERCENT BLACK RESIDENTS, ACCORDING TO THE U.S. CENSUS, THE RACIAL DISPARITY WAS EVIDENT AT THE MEETING.

"WHEN I SAID WE ARE GOING TO RESPECT FOLKS, LET'S LOOK AT THAT PIECE OF COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT," HERRINGTON SAID.

THE PRACTICE, KNOWN AS "SURVIVAL SEX," INVOLVES TRADING SEXUAL ACTS FOR FOOD, SHELTER OR OTHER IMMEDIATE NEEDS. STUDIES HAVE ESTIMATED THAT <u>28% OF HOMELESS YOUTH</u> AND RUNAWAYS ENGAGE IN SURVIVAL SEX. OTHERS HAVE PUT THE NUMBER AS HIGH AS 50%, WITH <u>LGBTQ YOUTH SEVEN</u> <u>TIMES</u> MORE LIKELY THAN HETEROSEXUAL PEERS TO EXCHANGE SEX FOR A PLACE TO STAY.

"THE QUEER FOLKS ARE YOUR CANARIES IN THE COAL MINE IN THIS HOMELESSNESS ISSUE," RACIAL JUSTICE AND LGBTQ ACTIVIST KAMORA HERRINGTON SAID.


